 "Families could have suffered bereavements in the second half of 1783 due to a massive volcanic eruption in Iceland that started on the 8th June. This affected the whole of Europe for months with a sulphurous fog and was followed by one of the worst winters on record".
 The New Scientist also stated that an extra 30,000 deaths resulted in 1783 and another 8,000 extra in January/February, 1784.

PROPERTY:LDS Film No.1278998: Land Tax and Personal Estate Records for
 Trowbridge, Wiltshire, England from 1773 to 1782.

George Martin appears in the Land Tax Records in Trowbridge in 1773 for *Bulgon Castle (sic) (tax 16s.8d.) and Part of the Halve (tax 6s.3d.). His Personal Tax on Fifty Pounds was 7s.6d. The same as above was recorded for 1774.
 Another three Martin names mentioned in these records were Abraham, Thomas and Daniel. (Sometimes noted as "Bulgins Castle").

In 1780, George Martin paid land tax on a dwelling house occupied by himself (\$1/2/3), and paid tax on a field in part of the Halve which was also occupied by himself - (4/2). The same again in 1781 and 1782. He died in 1783 and disappeared from the land tax records in that year. Abraham, Thomas and Daniel were still appearing in the records in 1783.

From the late 18th century, the houses in this street were the homes of middle-ranking clothiers and their employees. First on the left is Trellis Cottage, sole survivor of a terrace of six. Then there is a mid-19th century ashlar house, with a row of one and half-storey cottages at right angles to the road, followed by a range of two and three-storey houses dating from the 1790's with some fine examples of Trowbridge brick. On the right hand side stands Dorset House, three storeys in brick and of the early 19th century. Next is the building occupied by Cousins and Wright, again three storeys and dating from the early 19th century, but this time in stone. Trowbridge

Trowbridge began life as a settlement on a ridge of stoney subsoil by the little river Biss. Its growth to urban status started with the building of a castle by the 'De Bohuns' early in the twelfth century. The town was well developed when the wool trade took off, and shared in the general wealth associated with weaving mills. when the wool trade died out industry was replaced by a factory making steam engines, some breweries and a bed making factory. Trowbridge's chief distinction is that it houses Wiltshire's county offices. For all practical purposes it is the county town and has been so since 1893. To visitors this may seem a little strange what with Salisbury being the Cathedral town, Swindon being the largest, and Devizes being the more central.

The reason for this is due to communications, throughout the county communicating was always a problem because of the Salisbury plain, all the main railway lines ran east to west in the south of the county hence Trowbridge was the more accessible from places as it could be reached by rail.

PROBATE:

Following is the Will of Elizabeth Martin (nee Pitney) of Trowbridge, Wiltshire - the wife of George Martin of Trowbridge - (Bulgins castle and part of the Halve) and the mother of the children mentioned in her Will. All the said children were christened in Trowbridge Parish Church but their parents were said to be "George Martin and Ann". Elizabeth must have been known as "Ann" while her husband, George, was alive. She was known as "Elizabeth" at the time of her marriage to George Martin, in Shepton Mallet, Somerset, in 1756 and after George's death in 1783. The younger son mentioned was "John" who was the father of James

Lastly I appoint my said Daughter, Susanna Elizabeth, my sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills made by me. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of July, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifteen.~~~~~ Elizabeth Martin ~Thus signed sealed and delivered as the last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Martin in the presence of us, Tho.I. He was born on in St. Botolph's Bishopgate, London on 17th February, 1778 and was about 36 years of age by the time of the 1814 voyage. He died aged 79 years in 1857. A White Camellia Japonica, called by the Horticultural Society, Welbankiana, after Captain Welbank who imported a plant in 1816. It bloomed in 1819. There is a detailed account of the many varieties of Camellia imported to England by Captain Welbank and Captain Rawes, and written by the sister of Captain Rawes, Mrs Palmer of Bromley, in a letter dated November, 1820.
